

Storytelling: Tales of the Punjab

Key Stages 1 and 2

90 minute facilitated session (available 30 Oct 2017 – 19 Jan 2018)

To accompany the Crafts of the Punjab exhibition, this storytelling workshop uses many different artworks and objects to tell tales from the Punjab. Children will see paintings, sculptures, textiles, weapons and jewellery as well as the famous Golden Throne of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, which is appearing in the West Midlands for the first time. Additionally, there will be a chance for pupils to draw their own patterns in the gallery, inspired by the wonderful items on display.

Learning outcomes

Your students will:

- Develop competency in the arts of speaking and listening
- Increase knowledge of myths and legends and retelling of these orally
- Increase familiarity of traditional stories from other cultures and tradition
- Use discussion and role play in order to learn
- Evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design
- Know about great artists, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms
- Produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences
