There is a bus stop just outside the Art Gallery and Museum. For more information about city centre routes please call 024 7681 7035.



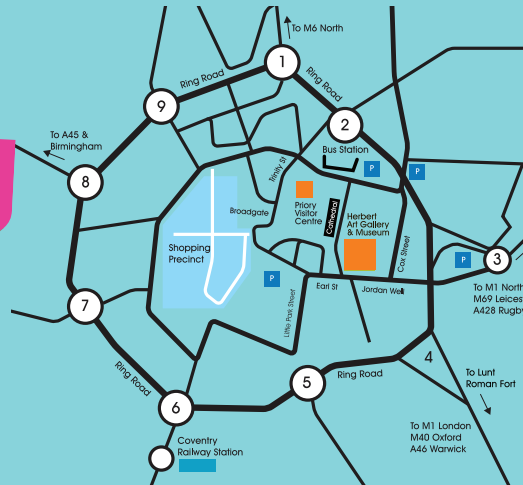
Train
