



## What is the Coventry Open?

An 'Open' is an exhibition in a gallery where the local communities can enter their work; it does not matter what your previous arts experience is

In Coventry the Open is shown at the Herbert Art Gallery & Museum

It is held every two years

This is a free to enter competition with prizes

You can sell your work commission free if you choose

For the first time ever there are two artist categories to enter work in:

- 1. Young artists aged 15-18 years
- 2. Over 18's

## **Entering work**

You can enter a maximum of two pieces made after March 2020; they can be of any of the

following types:

- Painting
- Drawing
- Photography
- Digital
- Print
- Sculpture
- Mixed Media
- Installation
- Video/Audio
- Performance
- Even work you've made as a group

Submitting your work is free





























### Where do I have to live?

Artists must be aged 18 and over for the adult category, and 15-18 years in the young person's section. You must be living, studying or working in the West Midlands region:

- Herefordshire
- Shropshire
- Staffordshire
- Warwickshire
- Worcestershire

#### Or, the Metropolitan districts of:

- Birmingham
- Coventry
- Dudley
- Sandwell
- Walsall
- Wolverhampton







## Rules

There is a long list of rules on the Herbert Art Gallery & Museum's website for you to look at. However, the key things to know are:

2D work cannot be bigger than 2m in any direction, this includes the frame

3D work must be able to be carried by one person and not be bigger by 1.5m in any direction

Electronically powered work must be safe to plug in and have it in writing that it has be portable appliance tested (PAT)

Films should not be longer than 5 minutes running time

Work submitted must be made by you and be original

Every piece must have been made after March 2020

The Herbert Art Gallery & Museum will not exhibit anything that is unsafe or inappropriate



## How to upload



When uploading your work take as long as you need, the website will not time out



You can only enter your work by submitting it online on the Herbert Gallery & Museum's website: <a href="https://covopen.oess1.uk/">https://covopen.oess1.uk/</a>

There are separate buttons for each of the Open's categories (Young Artists 15-18 years, and over 18s), make sure you enter your work in the right category



Follow the questions through the application process and answer them as best as you can

You will be asked about your piece. Write a few sentences to describe it. The following questions might help:

- Why did you make it?
- How did you create it?
- How does it make you feel?

You will need a tape measure and camera. Mobile phone photographs are fine. You will need to add the size of your work in centimeters and upload clear images to give you the best chance of being selected.

There are two rounds of selection:

- 1. Online
- Drop off your work at the Herbert Art Gallery & Museum

Successful pieces are exhibited, unsuccessful pieces are asked to be collected by the artist
