HIGHER EDUCATION MODULE "ACCESSIBLE CULTURAL HERITAGE FOR ALL" (IO3) – MOBILITY VISIT TO UK

The 15-day mobility visit to Coventry University, UK was undertaken between 9th October 2022 – 23rd October 2022. Fifteen students joined the mobility from the University of Burgos, Spain; University of Klaipeda, Lithuania, and University of Ljubljana, Slovenia.

The visit aimed to further develop student knowledge and understanding of accessibility in cultural heritage and provide experience of learning in an English classroom. During the visit the students learnt about UK guidance and best practice in accessibility and inclusion and received specialist input from organisations that focus on supporting, advancing and championing accessibility.



The teaching and learning methods employed involved hands-on learning activities, collaborative group-work, experiential learning as well as by lecture and direct instruction. Student reflection was encouraged, as well as the completion of assignments to test their application of the learnt knowledge and skills.

ONLINE ADULT COURSE "ACCESSIBLE CULTURAL HERITAGE FOR ALL" (IO4) – FINAL STAGES

The online course for cultural workers has been tested by partners. Pilot visits to museums will be the final test stage.



After the testing of online course by cultural workers, now it is time for the visits to museums where cultural workers, together with people with disabilities, will practice the learned content. After that, and receiving the feedback from cultural workers, Culture Coventry will finalise the course, an intensive adult training integrated in a well thought e-learning environment in 5 partner languages (English, Spanish, Slovenian, Lithuanian and Italian) and prepared in unique multidisciplinary teaching and learning materials.
